Elephant Toothpaste Luke Sewell

Intro

This is my lab report on Elephant Toothpaste. I am trying to figure out what the chemical reaction looks like when I do the procedure.

Hypothesis

I think that I will find out how the chemical reaction happens and what it looks like.

Materials

- 20-Volume hydrogen peroxide
- Tablespoons of yeast
- 3 tablespoons of warm water
- Liquid dish soap
- Liquid food colouring
- 16 Oz container
- Safety glasses
- Funnel (optional)

Method

1. Place down a tray to catch the eruption. Then, pour your 1/2 cup of hydrogen peroxide into your container.
2. Add about 10-20 drops of food coloring.
3. Add a squirt of dish soap and give it a gentle swirl.
4. Make the yeast mixture. In a measuring cup, stir the warm water and yeast until fully incorporated.
5. Pour the yeast mixture into the hydrogen peroxide/soap mixture and watch what happens!

Results

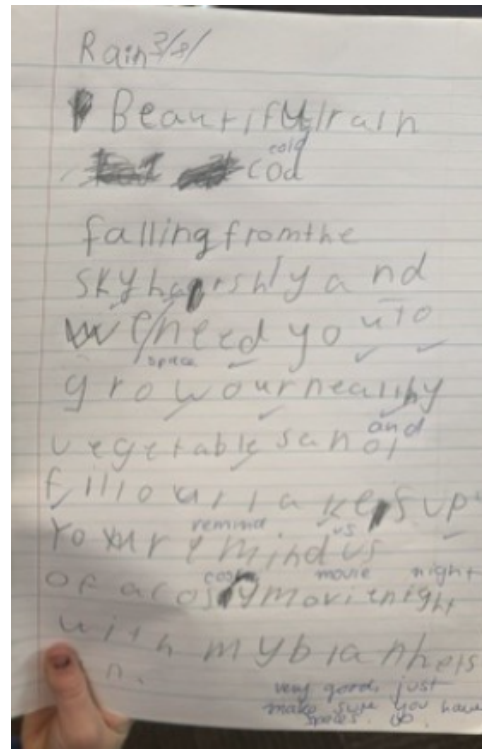
When you finish the experiment, you will see a large snake of foam that comes out!

Discussion

The main chemical reaction in the experiment is the decomposition of hydrogen peroxide (H_2O_2) into water (H_2O) and oxygen gas (O_2), catalyzed by the yeast. A catalyst is a substance that increases the rate of a chemical reaction without being consumed as well. The oxygen gas produced in the reaction quickly escapes, but when you add dish soap, it traps the oxygen gas, creating a large amount of foam. It looks like toothpaste for elephants, hence the name "Elephant Toothpaste".

Conclusion

In conclusion, my hypothesis was correct. I did find out how the chemical reaction works eventually, through the discussion. I also did find out what it looks like, a giant snake of foam coming out of a container.
